Hale Kūola Opens

This past May, Hāna Health opened the "Hale Kūola" Rehabilitation and Support Center and initiated community based physical therapy services. The Rehabilitation and Support Center is a 3,821 square foot facility which includes the physical therapy center and space for behavioral health care, traditional healing services and administrative offices. This project was a years long effort to bring an expanded level of health care to Hāna. New services will be coming on line over the next two years to better meet the overall health needs of Hāna residents.

The goal of the project was to reduce the number of Hāna Health patients with poorly managed diabetes and hypertension through increased access to and consumption of nutritious foods with an emphasis on traditional Hawaiian foods.

Hāna Health and Hāna Fresh will continue to address food security and nutrition through our new "food as medicine" initiatives. Stay tuned.





Funded through the Administration of Native Americans and Honu'apo, project results were largely positive.


