SPECIALTY SERVICES

Hāna's exceptional location impacts every aspect of our daily lives and at times imposes unique challenges. Having access to affordable, specialized health care services is one of those challenges. Patients are often faced with difficult choices when it comes to securing needed specialty care—take the drive (five hours round-trip), fly at great expense and inconvenience, temporarily relocate to the “other side” or forego treatment altogether. Hāna Health is working to solve this problem, one specialty at a time, through the integration of specialty care into

the primary care setting. This year we have expanded our women's health care service, added pediatric dentistry and secured new eye health technology. Completion of the Rehabilitation and Support Center will bring additional services to Hāna District residents in the coming months.



Hāna Health Earns 3 HRSA Awards

The Health Resources and Services Administration, an agency of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, recognized Hāna Health with its **Access Enhancer** award for programs that increased the number of patients served. The **Health Disparities Reducer** award was given for improvements in clinical quality management. A **Covid-19 Public Health Champion** award recognized Hāna Health's public health services during the Covid-19 public health emergency.

Women's Health Care

In conjunction with the Maui Lani Group, Hāna Health has expanded women's health care services to include obstetrics and gynecology, in addition to the full range of reproductive and family planning services. Dr. Stacy Ammerman, and Dr. Christy Takemoto, are both board certified OB/GYNs providing care to Hāna's women on a rotating basis, one day a month. Additional days of service will be added as community need for care grows.

Pediatric Dentistry

Pediatric Dentistry has been added to Hāna Health's dental services. Dr. Benjamin Hanks, DDS specializes in providing dental care for children up to the age of 12, but is available for older children as well. As a father of five himself, Dr. Hanks is dedicated to providing each child with the best care possible.

Diabetic Retinopathy Screening

Thanks to support from the Hāna Maui Trust, diabetic retinopathy screening is another technological advancement introduced to our patients this year. Early detection of diabetic retinopathy can reduce vision loss by 95%. Hāna Health providers can now easily perform retinal exams in the clinic using RetinaVue, a special hand-held camera used to take photos of the retina. These photos are forwarded to a retinal specialist for evaluation. A diagnostic report and management plan is returned to Hāna Health the same day.

Hāna Health's Mobile Clinic

Hāna Health has partnered with Hāna High and Elementary School to improve access to medical and behavioral health care for the school population, both students and staff. Hāna Health's Mobile Clinic is currently on the school campus 2—3 days per week.

Services to the Keanae community have also been initiated, starting with one day a month and plans for expansion as the patient need increases. The mobile clinic will be visiting the Kipahulu community beginning in October 2022, while travel logistics to Kaupo are still being worked out.

The federally-funded mobile unit will provide easier access to health care throughout the district and allow for a greater health care response during a pandemic or other health emergency. Healthcare services include wellness exams, acute care, chronic disease management, health screenings, and immunizations, including COVID-19 and flu vaccinations.





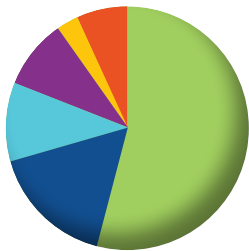
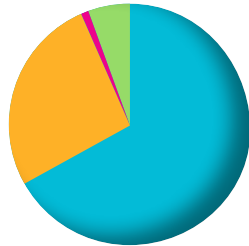
Mai E 'Ai

Improving access to traditional Hawaiian foods may be key to restoring community health. Hāna Health's Mai E 'Ai project is designed to reduce the number of Hāna District Native Hawaiians with poorly managed diabetes and hypertension through a transition to a more traditional diet. Funded by the Administration for Native Americans and the Honu'apo Foundation, the project is already demonstrating that a diet rich in traditional foods and fresh produce can improve the health of those with chronic conditions. A grocery bag containing a selection of nutritious foods that may include poi, taro, sweet potato, ulu, leafy greens, a variety of fresh produce and a healthy protein is distributed to 80 program participants weekly. After one year in the program, almost 79% of participants have improved measures for hypertension and diabetes. We look forward to a continued positive trend in the coming year. School Nutrition Program

Eating behaviors and meal habits in early childhood influence food preferences and eating patterns in adulthood and ultimately on health. Hāna Fresh has been working with Hāna High and Elementary School for the past several years to foster healthy eating habits among elementary school students. Hāna Fresh provides fresh, packaged fruits and veggies to approximately 100 elementary school students twice weekly, in an effort to improve nutritional intake, develop a taste for fresh produce and improve youth decision-making when selecting snacks.

Rehabilitation and Support Center

Construction of the Hāna Health Rehabilitation and Support Center is nearing completion, with a Certificate of Occupancy expected by the end of 2022.



The introduction of new services will begin sometime in the Spring of 2023 starting with physical therapy, followed by chiropractic care, cardiac rehabilitation, and traditional healing services. The \$5.3 million, 3,800 square foot, multipurpose facility is located immediately behind the medical center. We are grateful for the support of HRSA, the Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Foundation, the Atherton Family Foundation, the McInerney Foundation, Congressman Kai Kahele and State Senator Lynn DeCoitte.

We look forward to providing an expanded level of care right here in Hāna and reduce the travel burden for district residents who have had to travel to the "other side" to secure these services.



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
