Mahalo & Aloha to Harry Hasegawa

Harry Hasegawa, Hana Health's founding member and guiding light, passed away on September 2, 2024. Harry was instrumental in protecting access to health care for the Hana community. In 1995, when the Hana Medical Center was on the verge of closure, Harry spearheaded the effort to create the private, non-profit federally qualified health center Hana Health (dba Hana Community Health Center).

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Hana Fresh Farm Stand Re-Opens

The much-anticipated re-opening of the Hana Fresh farm stand took place this past May 2024. Focusing on nutritious eating, as an important component of a healthy lifestyle, Hāna Fresh grows, prepares and markets food that supports the health and food security of the Hāna community. The farm stand is currently open Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 11:00 am - 3:00 pm and features certified organic fruits and veggies grown on the Hana Fresh farm, as well as fresh juices, smoothies, salads and other nutritious lunch options. Plans for the operation of a new "mobile" farm stand and Mai e 'Ai program will be rolled out in early 2025.

Through his advocacy, Act 263 was passed during the 1996 legislature which provided for the transfer of the state-run medical center to the new non-profit organization.

It is because of Harry's foresight and leadership that the full range of primary medical, dental and behavioral health care, as well as 24 hour urgent care is available to all Hana District residents regardless of their economic circumstances.

Achieving "Medical Home" Status

Hana Health has been recognized as a Patient Centered Medical Home (PCMH) by the Accreditation Association for Ambulatory Health Care (AAAHC). This means Hana Health has met rigorous standards for providing top-quality, patient-focused care. It ensures that the health center follows best practices and constantly improves the quality of care.

For the rural community of Hana, this recognition is very meaningful. Patients can expect an even greater level of coordination in their care, with a strong focus on prevention, wellness, and managing chronic illnesses. The PCMH model emphasizes strong patient-provider relationships, enhanced access to care, and the integration of a wide variety of services; this is especially important here, as medical resources are harder to find. Patients will receive whole-person care that considers their physical, mental, social and cultural well-being, because better coordination of care means fewer hospital visits, and happier patients.

Better Access to Health Care for Hana Keiki

Hana Health has established a partnership with Hana High and Elementary School, to bring the school-based health center model to the Hana community. The center is staffed by a medical provider, licensed clinical social worker and a school-based health center coordinator. This program is designed to provide comprehensive primary care and mental health services directly to the students and staff at Hana School. Having Hana Health co-locate on the school campus facilitates student access to health services, reducing out of school time, alleviating the burden on the family to obtain services elsewhere and supports the promotion of healthy behaviors. Healthier students are better able to attend school, participate in instruction, and succeed academically.

The school-based health center model represents a significant step forward in community health, reflecting a shared commitment between Hana Health and Hana School to foster a healthier, more resilient community.

Growing Behavioral Health

Kekukuna Tringali has officially earned her Licensed Clinical Social Worker certification after 13 years of dedicated service as a licensed social worker, a well-deserved accomplishment. This achievement allows her to offer a higher level of care, providing therapy and expanding her role in supporting our community's well-being.

Sassie Keaulana has successfully completed her Bachelor's degree in Social Work and has just entered into the Master's in Social Work program. Kekukuna will be supporting Sassie, as her Clinical Supervisor, as she makes her way through this significant step in her professional journey that will allow her to grow, expand and enhance the level of care and service she can provide to the Hana community.
