Hāna Health is proud to expand essential specialty services for the Hāna community, bringing highly respected specialists from across the island directly to our clinic. Patients can now receive the specialized care they need close to home—without the long drive to central Maui. This expansion reflects our continued commitment to making high-quality healthcare more accessible and convenient for the Hāna community.

**Enhanced Physical Therapy Services**

Dr. Brenden Lewer has received advanced training and certification in the use of new, state-of-the-art equipment recently added to our Hale Kū'ola Physical Therapy Center. This technology enables Dr. Lewer to provide an even greater level of personalized care to patients on their recovery journey.

**Cardiology Care**

Dr. Amanda Marn, MD, a board-certified cardiologist, has been providing monthly cardiology clinics for Hāna Health patients for almost a year. She will soon enhance her services with new on-site ultrasound and stress-testing equipment, bringing comprehensive cardiac care closer to home.

**Expanded Pediatric and Dental Services**

Pediatric dentist Dr. Benjamin Hanks, DDS, has been providing exceptional dental care for Hāna's nā keiki (children) for more than two years. He looks forward to the future expansion of pediatric dental services with the construction of Hāna Health's planned Specialty Clinic.

Meanwhile, Dr. Whitwell is anticipating the arrival of a new panoramic X-ray machine, to be installed in the coming weeks, which will further enhance the quality and scope of dental care available to patients.

**Integrative and Complementary Medicine**

This year, Hāna Health expanded its complementary medicine offerings with the addition of Chiropractor Dr. Robert Gonzalez and Acupuncturist Tracy Erickson. Together, they strengthen our commitment to whole-person care—addressing the physical, emotional, and spiritual well-being of our patients.

**New Dermatology Services**

We are pleased to welcome Dr. Ann Brewer, a board-certified dermatologist who has been providing services for almost a year. Dr. Brewer provides care for patients of all ages, with a special focus on complex medical dermatology and diagnosis and treatment of skin cancers.

**Women's Health**

Dr. Stacy Ammerman, a board-certified OB/GYN, has been providing gynecological care to Hāna's nā wahine (women) for over two years. Her passion for women's health and new diagnostic equipment will allow her to better serve our patients.

It has been another busy and rewarding year for Hāna Health as we continue to improve access to vital specialty services—right here at home in Hāna.

## SHORT TAKES

### Federal Site Visit

Hāna Health underwent a three-day comprehensive federal site visit this past July and was found to be 100% compliant with all 94 requirements across three critical areas: governance, clinical operations, and financial management. Congratulations to our Board and staff for this outstanding achievement and continued commitment to excellence.

### Specialty Clinic Update

The development of the Hāna Health Specialty Clinic reached another milestone with the Maui County Council's approval of a district boundary amendment. This important step was made possible through the leadership and support of Councilman Shane Sinenci, who deserves our heartfelt gratitude. Next steps include DLNR approval, building permit acquisition, and fundraising for construction, all of which are currently underway.

### Hāna Fresh Expansion

New greenhouses under construction at the Hāna Fresh farm are expected to increase production by 30% and support Hāna Health's "Food as Medicine" programs. This expansion is supported through federal funding initiated by Senator Brian Schatz and the Stupski Foundation. A big mahalo to our partners for helping us continue to 'grow health' in the Hāna district.

### Workforce Housing

Three workforce homes are currently being developed to strengthen recruitment and retention of essential health center employees. This project is funded by the County of Maui, the Hawai'i State Legislature—through the efforts of Senator Lynn DeCoite and Representative Mahina Poepoe—and the Bank of Hawai'i. Completion of all three units is anticipated in late spring 2026.




